5.	Description of content: The legal instrument used to revoke the <i>Import health standard for the importation of commercial shipments of untanned cattle/sheep/goat/deer hides into New Zealand from the United Kingdom</i> .

7.	Nature of the urgent problem(s): The import health standard was revoked following confirmation of an outbreak of foot-and-mouth disease in the United Kingdom. The animal health measures in the import health standard had originally been developed to enable trade from a country recognized as free from foot-and-mouth disease. Therefore, these measures were inadequate to allow trade to continue from a foot-and-mouth disease infected country/zone. Import health standards allowing for the trade of cloven-hoofed live animals, viable genetic material and animal products from the United Kingdom have been temporarily suspended. The suspension will be reviewed once the extent of the foot-and-mouth disease outbreak is known and United Kingdom authorities have the disease under control. New Zealand will then consider reinstating the import standards if the United Kingdom has been able to effectively regionalize the disease.
