## NOTIFICATION

### Addendum

The following communication, received on 27 September 2004, is being circulated at the request of the Delegation of the United States.

#### Dinotefuran; Pesticide Tolerance

This regulation establishes a tolerance for combined residues of dinotefuran N-methyl-N'-nitro-N'-[(tetrahydro-3-furanyl)methyl]guanidine and its metabolites DN [1-methy-3-(tetrahydro-3-furylmethyl)]guanidine and UF [1-methyl-3-(tetrahydro-3-furylmethyl)urea], expressed as dinotefuran in or on vegetable, leafy, except Brassica, group 4 at 5.0 ppm.
