TECHNICAL COOPERATION ACTIVITIES: INFORMATION FROM OTHER INTERGOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS

WORLD INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY ORGANIZATION

At its meeting of 18-22 June 2001, the Council for TRIPS agreed to invite intergovernmental organization observers to the Council to update the information on their technical and financial cooperation activities relevant to the implementation of the TRIPS Agreement.

The present document reproduces the information which has been received from the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) by means of a communication dated 28 August 2001.

Communications from other intergovernmental organizations will be circulated as addenda to this document.

The relevant information is contained in a document entitled "WIPO's Legal and Technical Assistance to Developing Countries for the Implementation of the TRIPS Agreement from 1 January 1996 to 31 December 2000" (March 2001), which is attached.*

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- (i) The General Assembly of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) mandated the International Bureau in its 1994 and 1995 sessions to study and to provide assistance to the Member States of WIPO on matters related to the World Trade Organization (WTO), particularly on the Agreement on Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights (TRIPS Agreement).
- (ii) The above resolutions of the General Assembly of WIPO in 1994 and 1995 also led to the Agreement Between the World Intellectual Property Organization and the World Trade Organization (WIPO-WTO Agreement) of 1995, which came into force on 1 January 1996. This Agreement specifically provided for cooperation between WIPO and WTO on legal-technical assistance to developing countries with regard to the TRIPS Agreement.
- (iii) Pursuant to the mandate of the WIPO General Assembly and the WIPO-WTO Agreement, the International Bureau carried out extensive activities related to the TRIPS Agreement from 1 January 1996. These activities were mostly incorporated into the WIPO's ongoing cooperation for development programmes, which were organized mainly in response to requests received from developing country Members of WIPO. Such activities included legislative advice, awareness building and human resource development, institution building and modernization of the intellectual property system and enforcement. Additionally, they included studies and publications as well as the activities under the WIPO-WTO Agreement, which, in particular, led to the joint initiative launched by the two Organizations in July 1998.
- (iv) In the area of legislative advice, 119* developing countries and regional organizations were assisted in the form of preparation of 214** draft laws in the field of intellectual property (20 in 1996, 53 in 1997, 42 in 1998, 61 in 1999 and 38 in 2000). WIPO also prepared draft provisions to amend and modernize existing laws and made comments and suggestions on 235** draft laws (30 in 1996, 40 in 1997, 47 in 1998, 65 in 1999 and 53 in 2000) received from 134* developing countries and secretariats of regional organizations in developing countries. Additional assistance in the form of further comments or clarifications was provided in 170** cases to some 130* countries and regional organizations.
- (v) The *human resource development* programme of WIPO has always been a central part of its cooperation for development program. It was re-oriented, however, to include specific provisions of the TRIPS Agreement. Its activities involved, in particular, organizing some 137 regional meetings, including 8 "Mega" meetings in various regions of the world, 277 sub-regional and national meetings, including training courses, and around 140 interregional courses and seminars. More than 34,429 participants benefited from these activities. Some 226 study attachments were arranged for the benefit of developing countries, and on-the-job training took place in 72 developing countries. Preparation of periodicals, studies and reference materials to promote awareness of protection of intellectual property rights in general and of the TRIPS Agreement in particular has also been undertaken. The establishment of the WIPO Worldwide Academy shows the importance WIPO places on human resources development in order to provide a more complete assistance to developing countries in the area of intellectual property.

- (vi) Another important area is to assist developing countries *build up or upgrade* their intellectual property offices with adequate institutional infrastructure and resources, qualified staff, modern management techniques and access to information technology support systems. In this connection, WIPO sent advisory missions to 105 developing countries and sponsored visits of some 381 officials from developing countries to offices in industrialized countries to study various aspects of modernization. In regards computerization, some 98 countries received computer equipment from WIPO, and, with the assistance of WIPO experts, 42 developing countries have developed the necessary software for the automation of their intellectual property offices. WIPO has provided more than 308 CD-ROM workstations to national industrial property and copyright offices and developed industrial property information services for 87 developing countries. Strengthening the coverage and capacity of the present system and assisting developing countries in examination of patent applications, particularly in high-technology fields, have been given priority.
- (vii) *Enforcement* of intellectual property rights, as an integral part of the TRIPS Agreement, was incorporated into the WIPO programmes since January 1996. In order to raise awareness of enforcement in the area of intellectual property rights, WIPO has organized three interregional, 11 regional, 12 subregional and 67 national meetings concentrating wholly or partly on the enforcement provisions of the TRIPS Agreement. These meetings were in addition to the meetings mentioned in paragraph (v) above, where enforcement issues were also often included.
- (viii) A great number of *publications* have been produced by WIPO since 1996 in respect of the TRIPS Agreement. One notable example is the publication of a booklet that contains the WIPO-WTO Agreement, the TRIPS Agreement and the relevant texts of the conventions and agreements administered by WIPO or WTO in a single volume (WIPO publication No. 223). In addition, WIPO published a study, "Implications of the TRIPS Agreement on the Treaties Administered by WIPO," in June 1996, and four additional studies, made by other institutes or consultants at the request of WIPO, were made available in September 1996. These four studies were specifically focused on financial and other implications of the TRIPS Agreement.
- (ix) Under the WIPO-WTO Agreement, notable activities were in the areas of translation of laws and regulations, communication of emblems, activities done in cooperation and the joint initiative launched in 1998 by WIPO and WTO.
- (x) Assistance provided by WIPO on *translation of laws and regulations* between January 1996 and 31 December 2000, was to 156 countries (not limited to developing countries), for which laws and regulations have been translated from or into Arabic, Dutch, English, French, German, Portuguese and Spanish as required.
- (xi) Under Article 3 of the WIPO-WTO Agreement, *communications of emblems* and transmittals of objections under the TRIPS Agreement were administered by the International Bureau since January 1996, in accordance with the procedures applicable under Article 6ter of the Paris Convention.
- (xii) Numerous *cooperation activities* have been undertaken by the two Organizations pursuant to Article 4 of the WIPO-WTO Agreement, which requires enhancement of cooperation between WIPO and WTO in rendering legal-technical assistance. These activities included attending each other's meetings as an observer, participating in each other's symposia, workshops and seminars and providing experts as requested. In particular, WIPO and WTO jointly organized symposia every year between 1996 and 1999.

- (xiii) To further enhance cooperation, a *joint initiative* was launched by WIPO and WTO in July 1998 to assist developing countries Members of WTO meet their commitment by 1 January 2000. The joint initiative was in the form of a joint communication by the Directors Generals of the two Organizations and it was sent to the Ministers in charge of the matters dealt with by the two Organizations in each of the developing countries concerned. Letters of acknowledgement and requests for assistance have been received from 36 countries or territories from July 1998 to 31 December 1999.
- (xiv) Almost all developing countries have benefited from the legal-technical assistance programmes and activities of WIPO. Over 133 developing and least-developed countries and two territories benefited from the development for cooperation activities of WIPO that either dealt entirely with the TRIPS Agreement or were undertaken with a view to facilitate implementation of that Agreement. As a result, a number of countries have strengthened or embarked upon modernization of their legal and administrative infrastructures, and a greater attention given to the protection and enforcement of intellectual property rights has been noticeable. There is now a wide, enhanced awareness of the importance of intellectual property in general, and of the legal implications of the TRIPS Agreement in particular, around the world.

I. INTRODUCTION

1. This document provides a detailed account of the legal and technical assistance rendered by WIPO to developing and least-developed countries in relation to the implementation of the TRIPS Agreement and activities under the WIPO-WTO Agreement from 1 January 1996 to 31 December 2000.

2. The TRIPS Agreement was concluded as part of the Marrakech Agreement Establishing the World Trade Organization, and came into force on 1 January 1995. The link between the intellectual property system and global trade has been brought into sharp focus by the TRIPS Agreement. The Agreement is binding on all Members of WTO, most of which are also Member States of WIPO, as an integral part of the multilateral trading system established under WTO. The modernization of intellectual property systems and the strengthening of their legislative, administrative and enforcement infrastructures have become policy priorities in many developing countries owing to their obligations under the TRIPS Agreement. Table I gives a listing of the Members of WIPO, the Paris Union, the Berne Union and WTO.

3. The mandate for WIPO to provide legal and technical assistance in relation to implementation of the TRIPS Agreement comes from decisions taken by the WIPO General Assembly in its 1994 and 1995 sessions and is reflected in the WIPO-WTO Agreement of 1995, which came into force on 1 January 1996. The Programme and Budget of WIPO for the 1998-1999 and the 2000-2001 biennia further elaborated the scope of WIPO's assistance in regards implementation of the TRIPS Agreement.

4. In 1994, after the TRIPS Agreement was adopted in April, the fifteenth session (fourth extraordinary) of the WIPO General Assembly, held in Geneva from 26 September to 4 October, decided that "the International Bureau should be at the disposal of any State that expressly asks for advice on questions of compatibility of its existing or planned national intellectual property legislation not only with treaties administered by WIPO, but also with other international norms and trends, including the Agreement on Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights, and that the International Bureau should prepare studies on the implications of the said Agreement on the treaties administered by WIPO. It was noted that, as was the practice in WIPO, any such advice or studies would not constitute an official interpretation of any international agreement" (document WO/GA/XV/3, paragraphs 74 and 75).

5. During its sixteenth session (twelfth ordinary) held in Geneva from 25 September to 3 October 1995, the WIPO General Assembly concluded that the International Bureau should provide legal and technical assistance to developing countries in relation to the TRIPS Agreement and conduct studies on financial and other implications of the implementation of the TRIPS Agreement for developing countries. The General Assembly also agreed that the International Bureau should expand its existing development cooperation activities to cover the provisions of the TRIPS Agreement (document WO/GA/XVI/7, paragraph 24).

6. Under the WIPO-WTO Agreement, three areas of cooperation between WIPO and WTO were specifically provided, namely deposit of laws and regulations, implementation of Article 6*ter* of the Paris Convention for the purposes of the TRIPS Agreement and legal-technical assistance to developing country members of either WIPO or WTO, or both, in regards the TRIPS Agreement.

7. The WIPO Programme and Budget for 1998-1999 noted that the biennium will conclude with the crucial date of 1 January 2000, when the majority of the Members of WTO will be due to bring their national legislative and administrative structures into conformity with the TRIPS Agreement. Compliance with the TRIPS obligations, therefore, acquired urgency for many Members of WTO, as well as WIPO, and required the International Bureau to provide the necessary assistance to the countries concerned. The Programme and Budget emphasized that implementation of the TRIPS Agreement should not be viewed as an end in itself, but that national administrations should be

enabled to make optimum use of the opportunities created by the Agreement to ensure that a modernized intellectual property system contributed more effectively to national development and prosperity. The WIPO Programme and Budget for 2000-2001 provided for continued support to institution building and legislative efforts, and increased activities in the area of enforcement.

8. Pursuant to the above-mentioned decisions of the WIPO General Assembly and the WIPO-WTO Agreement, the International Bureau re-oriented its cooperation for development programmes. While it continued its assistance to developing countries through the traditional development cooperation activities, more focus was directed to assistance relating to the TRIPS Agreement. An emphasis was placed on providing support for developing countries not only in the modernization of legislative and administrative infrastructures with the immediate aim of bringing them into conformity with the TRIPS Agreement and other international obligations, but also enabling the upgraded intellectual property system to serve the larger goal of nation building. The cooperation for development programme and the activities undertaken in relation to the TRIPS Agreement have become more comprehensive and needs-oriented, extensively applying the mechanism of Nationally Focused Action Plans (NFAPs) to deliver tailor-made assistance to developing countries.

9. In addition to the re-orientation of its cooperation for development program, the International Bureau intensified its cooperation with WTO on numerous activities. At least one joint symposium was organized by WIPO and WTO every year between 1996 - 1999, and the two Organizations cooperated on collection of laws and regulations, communications of emblems pursuant to Article 6ter of the Paris Convention. The two organizations also launched a joint initiative in July 1998 in order to assist developing countries meet the 1 January 2000, deadline. Furthermore, WIPO published a great number of documents and studies that are widely circulated, such as the booklet that contains the TRIPS Agreement and all relevant provisions of the conventions and agreements mentioned in the TRIPS Agreement (WIPO publication No. 223), and the study entitled "Implications of the TRIPS Agreement on the Treaties Administered by WIPO".

10. The following paragraphs of this document and its tables provide a detailed (though not exhaustive) account of the legal and technical assistance provided by WIPO to developing and least-developed countries, particularly in the areas of legislative advice, promotion of awareness building and human resource development, institution building and modernization of the intellectual property system, and enforcement of intellectual property rights. They also provide an overview of activities carried out in cooperation with WTO and those under the WIPO-WTO Agreement.

II. LEGAL AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO DEVELOPING COUNTRIES FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE TRIPS AGREEMENT

A. Legislative Advice

11. As mentioned above, developing country Members of WTO (other than LDCs) were required to comply with obligations under the TRIPS Agreement by 1 January 2000. This generated an immediate response in WIPO's programme of cooperation for development, and for support to government efforts to undertake the legislative and administrative measures required for meeting TRIPS obligations.

12. From January 1996 to December 2000, the International Bureau of WIPO provided assistance, in the form of legislative advice, for a considerable number of developing countries, as shown in more detail in Table II.

13. The assistance was rendered by the International Bureau, at the request of the countries concerned, in the following forms:

- preparation of 214^{**} draft laws on intellectual property subjects (20 in 1996, 53 in 1997, 42 in 1998, 61 in 1999 and 38 in 2000) for 119^{*} developing countries and regional organizations covering, as required, the protection of patents, industrial designs, trademarks for goods and services (including collective marks), geographical indications, layout-designs or topographies of integrated circuits, utility model certificates (where requested), copyright and related rights and protection against acts of unfair competition;
- preparation of draft provisions to amend and modernize existing laws in the field of intellectual property;
- preparation of comments and suggestions on 235^{**} draft laws (30 in 1996, 40 in 1997, 47 in 1998, 65 in 1999 and 53 in 2000) prepared by and received from 134^{*} governments of developing countries and secretariats of regional organizations in developing countries.

14. In a number of cases, additional assistance was provided by WIPO in the form of further comments or clarifications following receipt of the reactions of the Governments concerned to the draft laws, studies and comments concerned. This assistance was provided in about 170^{**} cases (27 in 1996, 23 in 1997, 36 in 1998, 51 in 1999 and 33 in 2000) for some 130^{*} countries and regional organizations:

- in discussions with government officials in missions undertaken by WIPO staff members or WIPO experts to the countries concerned;
- in discussions with WIPO staff members during study visits to Geneva by government officials financed by the WIPO Secretariat;
- in the form of legislative advice given in discussions with government officials in Geneva on the occasion of their participation in WIPO activities including, in particular, WIPO committee meetings and conferences.

15. Furthermore, WIPO organized workshops specially designed for legislative draftsmen from Caribbean countries and a number of countries in Asia and the Pacific in order to familiarize them with the nature and main features of industrial property protection and legislation. A similar workshop was held in March 2000 for legislative draftsmen from African countries to familiarize them with intellectual property protection and legislation.

B. Awareness Building and Human Resource Development

16. The human element is crucial to the establishment and exploitation of the intellectual property system. WIPO's human resource development programme has always been a central part of its cooperation for development program, but it has become even more important to developing countries in the wake of the TRIPS Agreement. Implementation of the TRIPS Agreement requires a proper understanding of its provisions and their implications and an awareness of its role as a determinant of international trade and technology transfer on the part of governments as well as civil society. A reservoir of manpower is needed to implement and work the Agreement. In addition, awareness and training programmes have to be extended to a larger number of interest groups. WIPO therefore re-oriented and expanded its human resource development and training programme (content, facilities

and mode of delivery) and aligned them with TRIPS requirements in order to take account of the specific needs of a diverse range of beneficiaries. Table III provides details of activities carried out in various countries by region, and Table IV lists activities undertaken at the interregional level.

17. A major part of WIPO's assistance to developing countries for implementation of the TRIPS Agreement relates to the promotion of public awareness of the importance and implications of that Agreement and its crucial role in international trade, and also to the development of human resources and training of personnel for its implementation. Since January 1996, WIPO has been carrying on a broad range of activities to cater to the urgent needs of the developing countries in the areas concerned. Those activities include, in particular:

- organizing meetings of policy-makers and senior officials at the regional level to discuss the implications of the TRIPS Agreement for developing countries and to explore appropriate measures for its implementation. For example, some 137 regional meetings, including eight (8) "Mega" meetings in various regions of the world, were held to familiarize policy-makers and government officials on the requirements under the TRIPS Agreement and on its implementation. Over 10,940 participants benefited from these meetings;
- organizing subregional and national meetings (including training courses) for different target groups including policy-makers, legislators, the judiciary, customs and police officials, attorneys, right holders, the private sector, etc. During the period under review, 277 such meetings were organized for the benefit of some 21,638 government officials and also representatives of the private sector and other interest groups;
- conducting interregional introductory and specialized training courses for developing countries. Around 140 interregional courses and seminars have been organized for that purpose, resulting in the training of some 1,851 people since 1996;
- arranging study attachments for government officials from developing countries to WIPO and selected developed and developing countries, to learn from and exchange experience with other countries on implementation of the TRIPS Agreement. During the period under review, some 226 such study attachments were arranged for the benefit of developing countries;
- conducting on-the-job training for officials of the developing countries during WIPO-sponsored advisory missions on various subjects relating to the implementation of the TRIPS Agreement. During the period under review, such training took place in 72 developing countries;
- making use of national and regional institutions in developing countries for awareness-building and training purposes. During the period under review, partnership arrangements for organizing various symposia and training workshops have been made at regional and national intellectual property training institutions or centers, universities and research institutions in many countries of the world;
- preparing periodicals, studies, reference materials and public announcements to promote awareness of the protection of intellectual property in general and of the TRIPS Agreement in particular;
- promoting intellectual property teaching and research in universities, tertiary institutions, training centers and associations of various users of the intellectual property system.

18. Experts from WTO, other international organizations and intellectual property offices of industrialized countries were invited to participate, at WIPO's expense, in a large number of meetings or training courses organized by WIPO.

19. WIPO's cooperation for development activities were organized in close cooperation and consultation with a number of regional and subregional offices (such as ARIPO and OAPI) and economic or political groups (such as Andean Pact, ASEAN, BIMSTEC, Mercosur, SADC, SAARC, OAU and others) covering common areas of concern and sharing experiences and resources.

20. One concrete result of the above programme and activities has been the creation of a core of national and regional resource persons, who serve as speakers at regional, subregional and national meetings and as experts during advisory missions. Some 175 resource persons from developing countries have been invited by WIPO for such purposes.

21. The establishment of the WIPO Worldwide Academy (WWA) shows the importance of human resource development as a component of institution building in order to enable developing countries to meet their obligations under the TRIPS Agreement fully. The TRIPS Agreement has been included as a topic in all WWA training activities, making for greater outreach and a broader range of beneficiaries, including decision-makers, policy advisers, development managers, administrators, law enforcement officers and others. In this connection, the WWA will not only provide appropriate training, but also deliver more sophisticated and tailor-made training services for a broader range of recipients, including by remote access.

C. Institution Building and Modernization of the Intellectual Property System

22. A modern and well-functioning intellectual property system is an essential element for developing countries not only for effectively implementing the TRIPS Agreement but also for successful participation in the increasingly globalized economy and world trading system. National capacity for protection, management and use of intellectual property rights needs to be built up and sustained. The required administrative and institutional infrastructure entails forging functional linkages between intellectual property administrations and other national institutions in several areas such as research and development, industry, commerce, finance, teaching, environment and enforcement. In providing legal-technical assistance for developing countries, WIPO attaches the utmost importance to institution building and modernization of the intellectual property administration. Details of such activities undertaken in various countries, by region, are provided in Table V.

23. Since January 1996, WIPO has been assisting developing countries in building up or upgrading their intellectual property offices with adequate institutional infrastructure and resources, qualified staff, modern management techniques and access to information technology support systems. In this connection WIPO's assistance covered the following aspects among others:

- sending advisory missions, on request, to intellectual property offices in developing countries to give advice on modernizing management systems and streamlining administrative procedures. During the period under review, advisory missions of this kind were sent to 105 developing countries;
- sponsoring visits by the officials of developing countries to offices in industrialized countries to study various aspects of modernization. Some 381 officials benefited from such visits;
- formulating automation plans for intellectual property offices to deal with the administration, acquisition and maintenance of intellectual property rights, and providing the necessary hardware and software to support the implementation of such plans. During the period under review, some 98 such countries have received

computer equipment from WIPO, and, with the assistance of WIPO experts, 42 developing countries have developed the necessary software for the automation of their intellectual property offices;

- to initiate and strengthen the modernization process, WIPO has provided national industrial property and copyright offices of developing countries with more than 308 CD-ROM workstations. The workstations have been used for the purposes of patent and trademark search and examination, the storage of databases, the issuance of intellectual property titles and certificates and also for providing industrial property information services;
- developing of industrial property information services for the national industrial property offices in order to meet the needs of users in developing countries better. During the period under review, 87 developing countries benefited from this activity;
- strengthening the coverage and capacity of the present International Cooperation on the Search and Examination of Inventions (ICSEI), to assist developing countries in the examination of patent applications, particularly in high technology fields.

24. In order to build regional and national institutions for intellectual property teaching, research and training, WIPO:

- encouraged and collaborated in the setting up of such institutions or centers in a number of countries, e.g. China, India and Malaysia. It also strengthened its cooperation with existing institutions such as the International Intellectual Property Training Institute (IIPTI) in Daeduk, Republic of Korea, the China Intellectual Property Training Center, in Beijing, China, the National University of Singapore Centre for Management of Innovation and Technopreneurship (NUSCMIT), Singapore, and the Sri Lanka Foundation Institute in Colombo, Sri Lanka;
- promoted teaching of intellectual property subjects in several universities and other teaching institutions, encouraged creation of websites, assisted in training teachers and helped build-up libraries.

25. In order to create and strengthen national capacity for promoting invention and innovation and for exploiting indigenous creations and innovations, WIPO assisted in establishing inventors' societies in a number of developing countries and encouraged inventors through various award schemes. Activities were undertaken in the areas of licensing and technology transfer arrangements, valuation, commercialization and exploitation of intellectual property in close cooperation with intellectual property offices, universities, chambers of commerce and industry and financial and R & D institutions.

26. In the area of copyright and related rights, advice and assistance was given in connection with the setting up or strengthening of collective management societies in some 80 countries. WIPO has given its special support to the Regional Committee on Collective Management of Copyright and Related Rights for the Caribbean and has developed a Regionally Focused Action Plan (RFAP) to assist the 14 countries members of CARICOM in establishing a regional system for collective management of copyright using a network of strengthened national societies.

27. WIPONET, which is expected to be operational towards the end of 2001, will contribute significantly to developing national ability particularly that of developing countries, to use information technology in intellectual property offices, assist them in building up the necessary infrastructure and provide training in the use of the systems."

28. In the area of electronic commerce, in May 2000, WIPO published for the information of its Member States a "Primer of Electronic Commerce and Intellectual Property Issues." At the request of a number of its Member States, on 10 July 2000, WIPO convened the Second WIPO Internet Domain Name Process, to develop recommendations regarding certain outstanding intellectual property issues associated with Internet domain names. The Second WIPO Process is being conducted via a series of regional consultations in developing countries, in particular, as well as online consultations in response to published Requests for Comments. The Second WIPO Process will result in practical recommendations aimed at preventing and resolving conflicts in the domain name space. In addition, WIPO at the request of Member States, continues its efforts to develop best practices for domain name administration in the country code top-level domains (ccTLD).

29. WIPO has widely utilized regional, subregional and national projects to carry out its institution building and modernization activities. Since 1998, WIPO has implemented or is in the process of implementing 85 Nationally/Regionally Focused Action Plans (NFAPs/RFAPs,) for the benefit of 66 developing countries and three regional organizations. The objective of these Action Plans is to help intellectual property administrations meet development objectives, and assist in meeting immediate TRIPS-related requirements. Activities implemented under the Action Plans include legislative advice, human resource development training, expert missions, study attachments, seminars and automation support.

D. Enforcement

30. Enforcement of intellectual property rights is an integral part of the TRIPS Agreement. Part III of the Agreement lays down general principles for the enforcement of intellectual property rights and also specific procedures and remedies both civil and criminal, including border measures that must be available so that the holders of rights can effectively enforce those rights. The method of implementation of these provisions is left to each country, to allow for differences in their national legal systems. The TRIPS Agreement also provides that the enforcement provisions should be applied in such a manner as to avoid the creation of barriers to legitimate trade and provide safeguards against their abuse.

31. The enforcement obligations under the TRIPS Agreement have resulted in a large number of requests from developing countries to WIPO to advise and assist them in understanding the implications of the TRIPS enforcement provisions, establish and upgrade enforcement mechanisms, particularly with respect to border measures, and devise special programmes for judges, prosecutors, customs and police officials, attorneys, holders of rights and user interests. Table VI gives details of WIPO's assistance to developing countries in the area of enforcement. It should be noted that many activities listed in Tables II and III also broadly dealt with enforcement provisions of the TRIPS Agreement.

32. WIPO has expanded and adjusted its programme and activities to respond effectively to such requests. In order to create awareness of the importance and implications of the enforcement of intellectual property rights under the TRIPS Agreement, WIPO has organized three interregional, 11 regional, 12 subregional and 67 national meetings concentrating wholly or in part on the enforcement provisions of that Agreement. Many such meetings brought together a cross-section of intellectual property interests, including policy makers, government officials, enforcement agencies, judiciary, attorneys, holders of rights and consumer interests. Several other meetings focused on specific target groups such as administrators, judges, customs and police officials and other enforcement agencies. As well as using internal experts, WIPO drew from a wide range of sources such as WTO, the World Customs Organization (WCO), intellectual property offices, enforcement agencies in industrialized and developing countries, associations of holders of rights, industry representatives and the judiciary in order to present a clear and balanced view of the TRIPS enforcement provisions.

33. To enable developing countries to assess the conformity or otherwise of their existing enforcement mechanisms *vis-à-vis* the provisions of the TRIPS Agreement, a questionnaire was

drawn up by the International Bureau and supplied to certain countries at their request. Also expert missions were sent to some countries for the above purpose. Legal and legislative advice was provided for strengthening and upgrading enforcement mechanisms in conformity with the TRIPS Agreement. The review process under the TRIPS Council and proceedings under the dispute settlement mechanism of WTO were fully kept in view while guidance was provided on this subject.

34. The human resource development and training activities of WIPO focused on creating a core of trained personnel and imparting the necessary skills to enforce intellectual property rights. This was done in the form of the following action in particular:

- organizing a number of training courses and special meetings concerning the enforcement provisions of the TRIPS Agreement;
- convening three special WIPO Academy training sessions for enforcement officials;
- arranging orientation and study programmes for senior customs officials of 29 countries to act as trainers and resource persons; this was done in cooperation with WTO, WCO, the offices of industrialized countries and associations of holders of rights;
- organizing a number of colloquia for judges, and arranging interaction among judges, prosecutors and attorneys;
- promoting contacts among national focal points for enforcement;
- facilitating interaction among the associations of holders of rights, industry representatives and enforcement officials;
- providing documentation, equipment and training materials.

35. Some developing countries took a lead in setting up or identifying special courts for trying intellectual property cases. WIPO arranged study visits and training for the judges of such courts and provided documentation and reading materials for libraries. Similarly, whenever national mechanisms for coordination among various agencies were set up by countries, including intellectual property offices, enforcement agencies, judiciary, holders of rights and other interest groups, WIPO encouraged the move and provided such assistance and advice as was requested.

36. The NFAPs of several developing countries contain specific activities in the area of enforcement, including human resource development and modernization of administrations.

37. In the area of dispute settlement and resolution, countries were encouraged to make use of the WIPO Arbitration and Mediation Center. The Center has a number of mediators and arbitrators from developing countries on its panel of specialized neutrals. An on-line dispute resolution facility has also been developed by WIPO for expeditious electronic resolution of intellectual property disputes, particularly those arising out of electronic transactions and those relating to disputes concerning Internet domain names. The Center is currently administering a steadily increasing number of domain name cases with more 2,100 cases filed since December 1999 concerning domain names in the generic top level domains (gTLDs.)

III. STUDIES AND PUBLICATIONS ON THE IMPLICATIONS OF THE TRIPS AGREEMENT

38. Since 1996, numerous documents, including studies and papers, have been published by WIPO on the TRIPS Agreement provisions. Those documents, prepared by WIPO experts and officials, are mainly intended to be distributed among participants in WIPO-organized seminars, symposia, courses and workshops.

39. In addition, the International Bureau has undertaken and commissioned the preparation of special studies and publications assessing the implications of the TRIPS Agreement.

40. In October 1994, the WIPO General Assembly decided that the International Bureau should prepare a study on the implications of the TRIPS Agreement for the treaties administered by WIPO. WIPO published the study in June 1996 under the title "Implications of the TRIPS Agreement on the Treaties Administered by WIPO" - available in Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish - and distributed it widely among WIPO and WTO Members. The study takes the articles of the TRIPS Agreement one by one and, where the article seems to have "implications" for any WIPO-administered treaty, dwells longer on the article and points out, unless it is obvious, any possible change in the obligations of a State which is party to the treaty in question, but also a Member of WTO and, therefore, is or will be bound by the TRIPS Agreement.

41. In October 1995, the WIPO General Assembly mandated the International Bureau to conduct a survey of the financial and other implications of implementation of the TRIPS Agreement for developing countries. Accordingly, WIPO commissioned, and made available in English in September 1996, four independent studies from the following:

- Secretariat of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) in Geneva;
- Institute of Economic Research (IEO) in Munich and Brussels;
- Mr. Robert M. Sherwood (international business counsellor) in Alexandria, Virginia;
- Hungarian Ministry of Industry and Trade.

42. In 1996, WIPO published a single booklet containing the texts of the WIPO-WTO Agreement and the TRIPS Agreement and also the texts of other agreements or parts of agreements that are directly or indirectly referred to in the TRIPS Agreement.

43. In March 1998, WIPO published the revised edition of Intellectual Property Reading Material. This publication, which is available in English, gives information on the main fields of intellectual property protection; the international treaties and the administration of intellectual property and its role in development, including the TRIPS Agreement.

IV. ACTIVITIES UNDER THE WIPO-WTO AGREEMENT

44. The WIPO-WTO Agreement of 1995 entered into force on 1 January 1996, and contains three substantive areas, namely laws and regulations, implementation of Article 6*ter* of the Paris Convention and legal-technical assistance to developing countries. The relevant activities undertaken by WIPO under the WIPO-WTO Agreement are classified in this section and elaborated below under appropriate subheadings.

A. Laws and Regulations

Providing an information and documentation service in the field of intellectual property legislation

45. Within its Collection of Laws Section, WIPO provides an information and documentation service which is in charge of responding to enquiries, and requests originating in-house or received from external sources, concerning national legislation and treaties in the intellectual property field, and providing copies of the relevant texts. An average of 90 enquiries and requests per month are currently dealt with, approximately 60 of them from outside WIPO and 30 of them originating from WIPO officials. The external enquiries include an increased exchange of information between WTO and WIPO in the framework of the cooperation between the two Organizations. The Collection of Laws Section maintains and updates a paper Collection of legislative texts.

Maintaining and updating of the Collection of Laws for Electronic Access (CLEA)

46. CLEA was published on the Internet on 15 September 1999. It contains:

- more than 2,309 bibliographic data entries concerning international treaties, legislation of the European Communities and national laws communicated to WIPO by its Member States under Article 15(2) of the Paris Convention and Article 24(2) of the Berne Conventions, or notified to the Council for TRIPS and communicated to WIPO by WTO under Article 2(4) of the WIPO-WTO cooperation Agreement;
- 1,504 full texts of laws and treaties in electronic form, in English, French and/or Spanish.

47. The CLEA website so far covers the legislative texts of 35 countries and of the European Communities and the treaties administered by WIPO (a total of 21,216 pages). All legislative texts have embedded hyperlinks and are fully searchable. 216 additional bibliographic data entries, corresponding to 16 countries, are now available on the Internet.

The updating of CLEA is in progress; 7,714 pages corresponding to 252 legislative texts in English, French and/or Spanish have been converted into electronic format. The intellectual property legislation of 27 additional countries is in the process of being integrated in CLEA.

Publishing texts of laws and treaties

48. In its monthly periodical *Intellectual Property Laws and Treaties* (in English and French), WIPO publishes two legislative inserts, "Industrial Property Laws and Treaties" and "Copyright and Neighboring Right Laws and Treaties", in which texts of national laws and treaties are published in their most recent (whenever possible consolidated) versions. They incorporate the most recent versions of the relevant laws, and whenever possible they are published in a consolidated version.

49. The following legislative texts have been published in the inserts:

- in 1996, 102 in English (1,715 pages) and 97 in French (1,642 pages);
- in 1997, 72 in English (1,484 pages) and 95 in French (1,592 pages);
- in 1998, 81 in English (1,188 pages) and 68 in French (1,261 pages);
- in 1999, 60 in English (1,006 pages) and 58 in French (1,046 pages);
- in 2000, 48 in English (758 pages) and 48 in French (789 pages).

IPLEX

50. WIPO published, in May 2000, the new version of the IPLEX CD-ROM, which is a database containing legislative texts (multilateral treaties, regional laws, bilateral treaties, national laws) in English and French in the field of intellectual property (399 texts in English and 324 texts in French). The new version of the IPLEX CD-ROM is more user-friendly and functional and offers an extensive and flexible search system.

Assistance in the translation of laws

51. Assistance in the translation of laws and regulations is given by WIPO to its Member States forming part of the Organization's ongoing programmes. Under Article 2(5) of the WIPO-WTO Agreement, this service was made available to developing country Members of WTO that are not Member States of WIPO to enable them to fulfill their obligation to notify their laws and regulations to the TRIPS Council.

52. Between January 1996 and 31 December 2000, assistance in translation has been given to 156 countries (not limited to developing countries), for which laws and regulations have been translated from or into Arabic, Dutch, English, French, German, Portuguese and Spanish as required.

B. Article 6^{ter} of the Paris Convention

53. Under Article 3 of the WIPO-WTO Agreement, the communication of emblems and transmittal of objections under the TRIPS Agreement are to be administered by the International Bureau of WIPO in accordance with the procedures applicable under Article 6^{ter} of the Paris Convention.

54. Since 1 January 1996, the International Bureau has made, under Article 3 of the WIPO-WTO Agreement, the following communications:

- Communication to WTO Members not party to the Paris Convention of all the emblems so far communicated to the States party to the Paris Convention. Communications have been sent to the following 31 WTO Members (some of which, in the meantime, have become parties to the Paris Convention): Angola, Antigua and Barbuda, Bahrain, Belize, Botswana, Brunei Darussalam, Colombia, Djibouti, Dominica, Ecuador, Fiji, Grenada, Guatemala, Hong Kong SAR of China, India, Jamaica, Kuwait, Macao, Maldives, Mozambique, Myanmar, Namibia, Nicaragua, Pakistan, Papua New Guinea, Qatar, Sierra Leone, the Solomon Islands, Thailand, the United Arab Emirates and the European Communities;
- Communication of emblems for which protection has been requested since 1 January 1996, by States or intergovernmental organizations. Forty-nine such communications were sent to WTO Members not party to the Paris Convention between January 1996 and December 2000.

55. It should be noted that such communications are without prejudice to the date on which WTO Members are bound, under the TRIPS Agreement, to protect the emblems that were the subject of the communication.

C. Joint Activities of WIPO and WTO

56. The two Organizations are committed under the WIPO-WTO Agreement to provide certain legal-technical assistance and to enhance their technical cooperation activities under Article 4. Specifically, each Organization agrees to make available to developing country Members of the other Organization "the same legal-technical assistance relating to the TRIPS Agreement as it makes

available to [its own] Member States" under paragraph 1. They further agree, in paragraph 2, to "enhance cooperation in their legal-technical assistance and technical cooperation activities relating to the TRIPS Agreement for developing countries, so as to maximize the usefulness of those activities and ensure their mutually supportive nature". Lastly, they specify in paragraph 3, that the two Organizations "shall keep in regular contact and exchange non-confidential information" for the purposes of legal-technical assistance to developing countries.

57. Numerous activities have been undertaken by WIPO and WTO under Article 4 of the WIPO-WTO Agreement. These activities include attending each other's meetings as an observer, providing resource persons, in each other's symposia, workshops, seminars and training courses and, in particular, jointly organizing symposia.

58. The first symposium took place at WIPO for a half-day on 17 September 1996, and was entitled "Workshop on the Border Enforcement Provisions of the TRIPS Agreement." The second was on "Technical Cooperation Aimed at Improving Human Resources and Institutional Capacity Required to Implement the TRIPS Provisions on Domestic Enforcement," which took place at WTO, also for a half-day, on 14 July 1997, and the third, "The Process of Implementation of the TRIPS Agreement," was held at WIPO during the whole of 16 September 1998. In 1999, WIPO has jointly organized a symposium with WTO and UPOV, which was followed by three regional workshops on "The Protection of Plant Varieties under Article 27.3(b) of the TRIPS Agreement." The joint symposium took place on 15 February 1999, and the three workshops took place in the same year in Bangkok (18 and 19 March), Cairo (3 and 4 May) and Nairobi (6 and 7 May). In 2000, a joint symposium with WTO did not take place at the request of the WTO Secretariat. However, several joint symposia with a focus on assistance to least-developed countries (LDCs) are being planned for 2001.

D. WIPO-WTO Joint Initiative

59. In furtherance of the cooperation specified in the WIPO-WTO Agreement, WIPO launched a joint initiative with WTO in July 1998. The purpose of the joint initiative was to assist developing country Members of WTO meet the 1 January 2000, deadline for conforming to the TRIPS Agreement.

60. The joint initiative was in the form of a joint communication by the Directors General of the two Organizations, Dr. Kamil Idris of WIPO and Mr. Renato Ruggiero of WTO, which was sent to the ministers of each of the developing countries concerned. Its aim was for WIPO and WTO to maximize their use of available resources in the coming critical period by improved planning and coordination of technical cooperation activities, with an understanding that the bulk of the assistance would be coming from WIPO.

61. Many responses have been received from developing and least-developed countries since the launching of the joint initiative. In particular, letters of acknowledgement and requests for assistance had been received from 36 countries or territories. The requests received were comprehensive yet general in nature, and in most cases the assistance they sought did not differ from that already provided under the ongoing programmes of WIPO. Therefore, many of the requests were incorporated into the activities of the development cooperation programmes, which should be reviewed for a more complete account. As specified later in this document, 133 countries or territories have received or are receiving assistance under the ongoing programmes of WIPO in the area of TRIPS implementation.

62. In response to the requests made under the joint initiative, the two Organizations have met on several occasions and discussed the coordination of efforts and, in some cases, the joint handling of specific requests by holding a joint consultation with the requesting country or territory. The assistance requested has been provided to the Member concerned in the course of 1999 and 2000. In particular, a large number of WIPO and WTO missions took place in 1999, including a joint regional

symposium on "Implementation of the TRIPS Agreement" in Bangui, Central African Republic, for French-speaking sub-Saharan African countries from 23 to 26 March 1999. In addition, three national seminars were planned and carried out jointly by WIPO and WTO in Colombia, Cuba and Venezuela during the latter part of 1999 and in 2000.

63. For the least-developed country Members of WTO facing the 1 January 2006, deadline, a similar joint effort is planned to be carried out in 2001.

V. CONCLUSION

64. Almost all developing countries have benefited from the legal and technical assistance programmes and activities of WIPO. Specifically, a total of 133 developing and least-developed countries and two territories benefited from those development for cooperation activities of WIPO that either dealt entirely with the TRIPS Agreement or were undertaken with a view to facilitating the implementation of that Agreement. These were Afghanistan, Algeria, Angola, Antigua and Barbuda, Argentina, Bahamas, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Barbados, Belize, Benin, Bhutan, Bolivia, Botswana, Brazil, Brunei Darussalam, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cambodia, Cameroon, Cape Verde, Central African Republic, Chad, Chile, China (including Hong Kong SAR), Colombia, Comoros, Congo, Cook Islands, Costa Rica, Côte d'Ivoire, Cuba, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Djibouti, Dominica, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Egypt, El Salvador, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Fiji, Gabon, Gambia, Ghana, Grenada, Guatemala, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Guyana, Haiti, Honduras, India, Indonesia, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Iraq, Jamaica, Jordan, Kenya, Kiribati, Kuwait, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Lebanon, Lesotho, Liberia, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Madagascar, Malawi, Malaysia, Maldives, Mali, Marshall Islands, Mauritania, Mauritius, Mexico, Micronesia (Federated States of), Mongolia, Morocco, Mozambique, Myanmar, Namibia, Nauru, Nepal, Nicaragua, Niger, Nigeria, Niue, Oman, Pakistan, Palau, Panama, Papua New Guinea, Paraguay, Peru, Philippines, Qatar, Republic of Korea, Rwanda, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Samoa, Sao Tome and Principe, Saudi Arabia, Senegal, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, Singapore, Solomon Islands, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Suriname, Swaziland, Syrian Arab Republic, Thailand, Togo, Tonga, Trinidad and Tobago, Tunisia, Tuvalu, Uganda, United Arab Emirates, United Republic of Tanzania, Uruguay, Vanuatu, Venezuela, Viet Nam, Yemen, Zambia, Zimbabwe, the British Virgin Islands and East Timor.

65. The results of the legal and technical assistance programmes and activities of WIPO are reflected in a number of countries having upgraded their existing legislation or enacted new laws and revised or formulated implementing regulations for achieving conformity with the TRIPS Agreement. There is widespread awareness not only of the legal implications of the TRIPS Agreement, but also of its potential for beneficial use by countries. In this regard, a number of countries have already strengthened or embarked upon modernization of their administrative infrastructures. A reservoir of trained manpower has been created to implement and use the upgraded intellectual property system. Greater attention to the protection and enforcement of intellectual property rights and better enforcement mechanisms is also noticeable in a number of countries.

66. As far as assistance to the least-developed countries is concerned, following a decision of the WIPO General Assembly, the International Bureau established a Least-Developed Countries Unit in October 1998. The Unit is devoted to dealing with the special needs of those countries, and WIPO will continue and further intensify its focus on providing assistance to the least-developed countries for implementation of the TRIPS Agreement. During 1999, WIPO organized one High Level Interregional Roundtable and four regional seminars and a multi-disciplinary national seminar. The four regional seminars for the least developed countries (LDCs) focussed on the implementation of the TRIPS Agreement, and on institution building. In 2000, WIPO organized three regional roundtables for the least developed countries (LDCs) including a multi-disciplinary national roundtable. The roundtables focussed, *inter alia*, on the implementation of the TRIPS Agreement and on institution building.

67. The International Bureau of WIPO will continue to provide legal and technical assistance to those countries concerned and to closely cooperate with WTO. The scope of such assistance will be expanded to respond to the requests of developing and least-developed countries in matters connected with implementation of the TRIPS Agreement and related matters, including the review process and emerging intellectual property issues.
