NICARAGUA - ESTABLISHMENT OF A NEW SCHEDULE XXIX

Draft Decision on Extension of Time-Limit

Considering that by a Decision of 26 January 1994¹, the application of the provisions of Article II of the GATT 1947 was suspended to enable the Government of Nicaragua to implement the Central American Tariff System (SAC) which is based on the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (Harmonized System);

Noting that by successive decisions, the time-limit of the waiver granted to Nicaragua has been extended until 30 April 1998²;

Considering that by a Decision of 31 January 1995³, the General Council established a list of waivers existing at the entry into force of the WTO Agreement, which included the waiver granted to Nicaragua for the establishment of a new Schedule XXIX;

Taking into account that the Government of Nicaragua has submitted the necessary factual documentation for the initiation of negotiations⁴;

Noting that one Member which has reserved its right to enter into negotiations in accordance with Article XXVIII has not yet sent the Government of Nicaragua any request for clarification in that respect;

Considering that in order to fulfil the procedures established by the Council Decision of 12 July 1993 for rectification and renegotiation of the schedules of concessions negotiated in GATT under the Harmonized System and in order to hold consultations in conformity with the provisions of Article XXVIII, the Government of Nicaragua, having fulfilled the requirements of the Understanding in Respect of Waivers of Obligations under the GATT 1994, has requested a further extension of the waiver of its obligations under Article II of GATT 1994⁵;
