

EFTA-CZECH REPUBLIC FREE-TRADE AREA

Biennial Report on the Operation of the Agreement

Communication from the Parties

The report below presents the information received from the European Free Trade Association and the Permanent Mission of the Czech Republic, dated 28 May 1999. It is organized in accordance to the Standard Format for Information on Regional Trade Agreements (WT/REG/W/6).

The Agreement between the States of the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) and the Czech Republic was examined in accordance with Article XXIV of GATT.¹

In accordance with the guidelines approved by the Council For Trade in Goods,² as recommended by the Committee on Regional Trade Agreements,³ and the reporting schedule established by the WTO Secretariat,⁴ the Parties to the Agreement establishing the Free-Trade Area (FTA) between the EFTA States and the Czech Republic herewith provide their biennial report on the operation of the FTA since 1994. The biennial report outlines the major developments of the FTA and the trade relations between the EFTA States and the Czech Republic since the adoption of the report of the Working Party.

Main developments

The Parties have given considerable attention to the updating and upgrading of the FTA. The Joint Committee has since the entry into force of the Agreement adopted a number of Decisions deleting, amending or introducing new provisions. For further details, see Annex 1. The purpose of the updating has been to clean the text so that it reflects the current state of play, making it user friendly for economic operators.

The aim of the upgrading has been to amend the Agreement *inter alia*, in the light of developments at the regional and/or international trade scene such as the introduction of "new" WTO rules. The FTA has been upgraded in the fields of processed agricultural products, rules of origin and methods of administrative cooperation, technical regulations and protection of intellectual property.

The FTA has been issued in a loose-leaf version, which is available in electronic form on the EFTA website.⁵

I. BACKGROUND INFORMATION ON THE AGREEMENT

1. Membership and Dates of Signature, Ratification and Entry into Force

The Agreement was signed on 20 March 1992, originally between the EFTA States and the Czech and Slovak Federal Republic (CSFR). Following the dissolution of the CSFR on 31 December 1992, a Protocol on the succession by the Czech Republic to the Agreement was signed on 19 April 1993.

The Agreement entered into force on 1 July 1992. Austria, Finland and Sweden ceased to be Parties to the FTA, following their withdraw from the EFTA Convention and subsequent accession to the European Union on 1 January 1995. Liechtenstein has applied it provisionally as of 1 January 1997.

4. Trade Data

According to EFTA statistics, in the period 1994 to 1997, trade between the EFTA States and the Czech Republic experienced continuous growth. Total trade rose by as much as 61.8 per cent; EFTA imports from the Czech Republic grew by 69.8 per cent, while EFTA exports to the Czech Republic increased by 57.3 per cent. The highest growth rate was observed in 1994 to 1995: total trade expanded by 42 per cent; EFTA imports increased by 51.2 per cent and EFTA exports by 36.8 per cent. The trend was more modest in 1995/96 and 1996/97 with trade on average growth rate of 6.5 per cent and 6.9 per cent respectively.

Despite the more rapid increase EFTA imports than EFTA exports in the period, the trade balance was clearly in favour of the EFTA States. In 1997 the EFTA States imported goods from the Czech Republic worth 336.6 million US dollars, while exports amounted to 547 million US dollars.

Among the EFTA States, Switzerland is the largest trading partner with the Czech Republic. In 1997, Switzerland accounted for 74.1 per cent of the trade, followed by Norway with 25 per cent and Iceland with 0.9 per cent.

There was no trade in products covered by Annex I of the Agreement (products excluded from the scope).

The share of trade in agricultural products was 3.76 per cent of total trade in 1997. Trade in agricultural products covered under the Agreement and the bilateral arrangements was 48.7 per cent of total trade in agricultural products in 1997 between the EFTA States and the Czech Republic.

In the period 1994 to 1997, total EFTA trade rose by 18.1 per cent or in absolute terms from 203, 479 million US dollars to 240,337 million US dollars. The growth rate fluctuated considerably from an increase of 17.8 per cent in 1994/95 down to 3.1 per cent in 1995/96 and further down to -2.8 per cent in 1996/97. The development of imports and exports followed the same trend.

In the period 1994 to 1997, the share of EFTA trade with the Czech Republic of total EFTA trade increased from 0.27 per cent to 0.37 per cent. With regard to other FTA partner countries, the share increased slightly from 2.3 per cent to 2.9 per cent, while for the 15 EU countries the share fell from 70.9 per cent to 69.7 per cent. For other countries the share rose slightly from 26 per cent to 26.6 per cent. In the period 1994 to 1997, the share of Czech trade with the EFTA States of its total trade decreased from 2.2 per cent in 1994 to 1.9 per cent in 1997.

II. TRADE PROVISIONS

1. Import Restrictions &

2. Export Restrictions

Both the EFTA States and the Czech Republic have dismantled and/or abolished customs duties and quantitative restrictions in accordance with the timetables of the Agreement. They have also accelerated the gradual dismantling/abolishing of certain trade restrictions such as the Norwegian customs duties on textiles and abolished exceptions for other trade restrictions such as Icelandic, Liechtenstein and Swiss customs duties of a fiscal nature. It should be noted that the abolition of these duties was done on a MFN basis.

With regard to processed agricultural products, the substance of Protocol A was brought in line with the rules of the WTO Agreement on Agriculture in January 1997. Furthermore, the principle of parallelism i.e. equal treatment between the Parties and between each Party and the European Communities (EC) was introduced and further concessions on liberalization was exchanged.

3. Rules of Origin

A new Protocol B on rules of origin and methods of administrative co-operation entered into force in January 1997. By the introduction of new pan-European rules of origin, diagonal cumulation among European countries interlinked with a network of free trade agreements was established.⁶

4. Standards

A Joint Committee Decision on amendment to Article 12 and Annex X on technical regulations was adopted in October 1996. Thereby, provisions on co-operation, consultations on measures that could or have created an obstacle to trade as well as provisions on notification under the WTO Agreement on Technical Barriers to Trade replaced the information procedure on draft technical regulations. The entry into force of the Decision is pending national acceptances.

III. GENERAL PROVISIONS OF THE AGREEMENT

5. Institutional Framework

A Joint EFTA-Czech Republic Committee has been established under the FTA. The aim of the Joint Committee is to supervise and administer the implementation of the Agreement, as well as to review the possibility of further removal of obstacles to trade between the Parties. The rules of procedure were adopted in April 1993. The Joint Committee is assisted by expert groups, in particular by the Sub-Committee on Customs and Origin Matters. Other expert groups can be convened, as agreed. Hitherto, five meetings of the Joint Committee have taken place.⁷

IV. OTHER

A Joint Committee Decision on amendment to Article 17 and Annex XI on protection of intellectual property was adopted in January 1997. The provisions of the Agreement were adjusted to reflect the WTO Agreement on Trade-related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights. Moreover the level of protection was strengthened in the areas of, *inter alia*, patent protection and trade mark protection. The entry into force of the Decision is pending national acceptances.

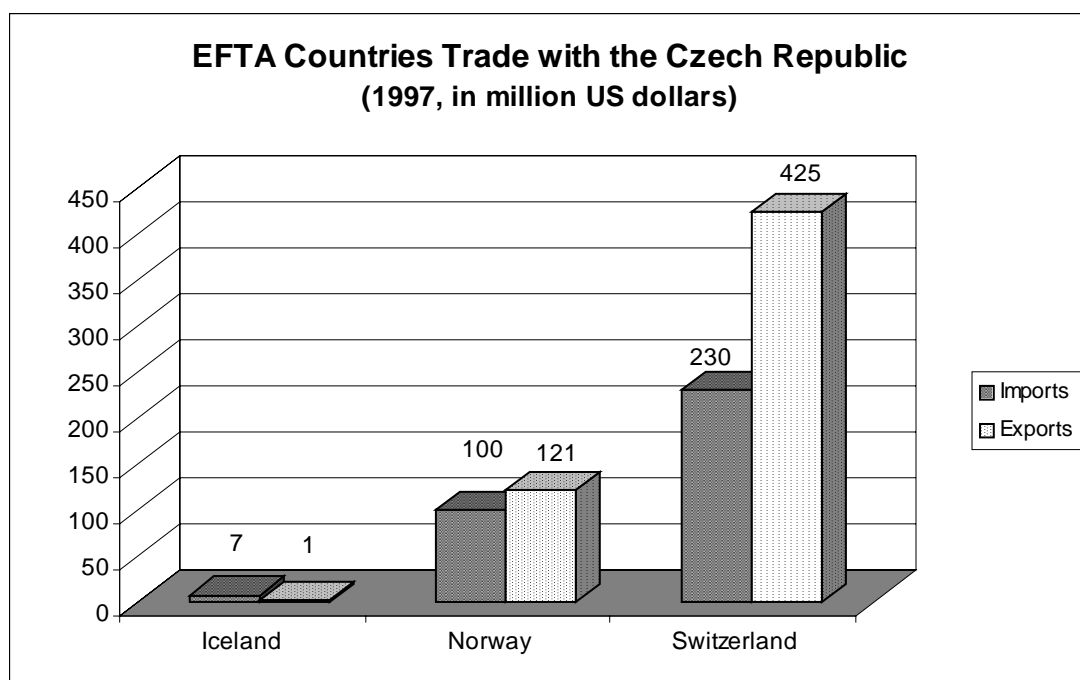
