Description of content: This regulation establishes a tolerance for residues of butafenacil (1,1-dimethyl-2-oxo-2-(2-propenyloxy)ethyl 2-chloro-5-[3,6-dihydro-3-methyl-2,6-dioxo-4-(trifluoromethyl)-1(2H)-pyrimidinyl] benzoate) in or on cotton and livestock commodities. Syngenta Crop Protection, Inc. requested this tolerance under the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (FFDCA), as amended by the Food Quality Protection Act of 1996 (FQPA). This tolerance is established in or on cattle, kidney; goat, kidney; hog, kidney; horse, kidney; and sheep, kidney at 0.05 ppm; in or on cattle, liver; goat, liver; hog, liver; horse, liver; and sheep, liver at 0.50 ppm; in or on cotton, undelinted seed at 0.50 ppm; and in or on cotton, gin byproducts at 10 ppm.
