REPLIES TO QUESTIONS POSED BY THE UNITED STATES¹
CONCERNING THE NOTIFICATION OF LAWS
AND REGULATIONS OF THE SLOVAK REPUBLIC²

The following communication, dated 1 April 1996, has been received from the Permanent Mission of the Slovak Republic.

1. *Prior to the implementation of the Uruguay Round Anti-dumping and Subsidies and Countervailing Duty Agreements did your country have anti-dumping or countervailing duty laws? If so, have those laws been revoked?*

Prior to the implementation of the Uruguay Round Anti-dumping and Subsidies and Countervailing Duty Agreements the Slovak Republic had no anti-dumping or countervailing laws.

2. *If you are in the process of drafting legislation, what is the estimated date for implementation of the legislation?*

The estimated date for the implementation of the new legislation is the end of the year 1996.

3. *Does your country have an organization which is responsible for administering anti-dumping or countervailing duty legislation, or which otherwise applies such remedies with respect to imports into your customs territory? If so, does the organization have any administrative guidelines for administering these laws?*

There is no organization responsible for anti-dumping or countervailing duty legislation due to the non-existence of such legislation. Relevant bodies will be designated to handle this issue by the final version of a new legislation.

4. *Does your country have any outstanding anti-dumping or countervailing duty findings?*

The Slovak Republic confirms that there are no anti-dumping or countervailing findings.
